A little bit about us....

The BreastScreen WA program provides free screening mammograms to women aged 40 years and over with no symptoms. We specifically target women aged 50 to 74 years, as the scientific evidence shows the benefit is greatest for women in this age group.

Since March 1989 more than 2 million screening mammograms have been performed at a BreastScreen WA service.

BreastScreen WA has eleven permanent screening clinics and four mobile BreastScreen WA services visit towns all over WA.

Wheelchair access is available at all BreastScreen WA services.

Appointments are available 7:30am-5:45pm on weekdays and 8:15-11:30am on Saturdays at most BreastScreen WA clinics.

Women can book online or phone 13 20 50 to make their free screening mammogram appointment.

The Program is part of the national BreastScreen Australia program and is governed by the National Accreditation Standards. In Western Australia, the state wide program is under the jurisdiction of the North Metropolitan Health Service of the Health Department of Western Australia.

BreastScreen WA aims to **reduce** the morbidity and mortality attributable to breast cancer, **maximise** the early detection of breast cancer in the target population, and **ensure** equitable access.

What we can do for you...



We provide free workplace and community educational presentations.*

If your workplace has a wellness program we can present on breast screening and general breast health. While we are there we can book eligible ladies in for their appointment, update their contact details and check when they're due for their mammogram.

*Conditions apply - at least 10 women over the age of 40 must be present

Reaching communities

We can target our communication to Aboriginal and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CaLD) women. Book a presentation with our Aboriginal or our CaLD Program Officer. Interpreters are available upon request and group bookings at one of our clinics can be arranged.


