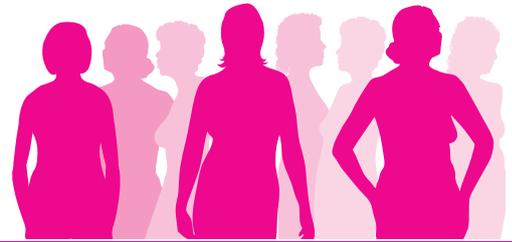

Screening Services Update



Radiographers at the Bunbury Assessment Clinic recently attended further application training from the Siemens application specialist.

The workshop reviewed the use of the stereotactic biopsy unit, especially the lateral arm attachment and checking the set up for the vacuum assisted biopsy needles. The assessment clinic the following day ran smoothly with increased confidence in the use of the equipment.

BreastScreen WA Open Day

On Saturday 19th July screening unit staff attended an "open day" at BreastScreen WA, Eastpoint Plaza to better understand how the PACS (Picture Archiving Communications system) relate to the MSR (Mammography Screening Register). Soft copy reading is dependent on electronic images being available for reading and confidence that the accompanying data is correct. Participants were shown the tools (see below) that are used to ensure the integrity of the data and images and some of the problems that arise when it's not!



BSWA extends opening hours

A recent survey of women attending for screening indicated an interest in the availability of early morning appointments. A similar survey of the screening unit staff also indicated a willingness to accommodate the request. As a result metropolitan clinics are now offering appointments from 7.30am on some mornings for the convenience of the women.

Website Statistics

A total of 8,896 women were screened in the month of June 2014. This includes 1,062 first screens. There were 20 screening days and an average of 445 women were screened each day at a BSWA clinic or mobile. For this reporting period the mobile service visited Collie, Mandurah, Albany and Geraldton.

MSR.NET

During August and September BreastScreen WA will be working hard to complete the roll out of the new version of MSR (client information, appointment booking and results system). In order to facilitate soft copy reading for BreastScreen WA it has been necessary to update the current version of MSR. The outdated technology has been replaced with MSR.Net. The MSR.Net version is already in use at the State Coordination Unit and at all screening clinics and will next be installed at the three assessment sites: RPH, SCGH and Bunbury Assessment Clinics.

The Assessment Clinics will receive information in August with regards to any screen or functional changes and a BreastScreen WA staff member will attend to ensure all staff are comfortable with the new version of MSR.
