The BreastScreen WA mobile mammogram service is about to make history with its first ever visit to Cue in February.

BSWA's regional mobile screening program started in 1990 with one unit, visiting the state's south-west. Since then the service has expanded to four units, visiting over 100 regional towns every cycle. Cue is the latest town to be included in the screening schedule.

Cue local, Ruth Lee, 58, said it was fantastic that the mobile screening service would be in town as it meant women would no longer need to travel to Mount Magnet to have their regular mammogram.

#### New assessment centre at Fiona Stanley Hospital



A new multidisciplinary breast assessment centre catering for metropolitan and rural clients from across Western Australia has opened at Fiona Stanley Hospital in Murdoch.

This new assessment centre complements BreastScreen WA's existing assessment clinics at Royal Perth and Sir Charles Gairdner Hospitals and the South West Health Campus in Bunbury.

Located on Level 1, the

breast centre is a purpose-built clinical area with:

- spacious consulting rooms
- a specialised breast surgery digital gallery for viewing 'real life' results following surgery
- dedicated medical imaging services
- specialised counselling services.

## New X-ray machine in Rockingham



BreastScreen WA's Rockingham clinic has increased its capacity to screen for breast cancers. An additional mammography machine will be introduced late February.

The extra x-ray machine is part of BreastScreen WA's service expansion and supports the rising current and future demand for women in the Rockingham region.
