
Dense Breast Survey: Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do I know if I have dense breasts?

You will have received a results letter from BreastScreen WA recently. For women with dense breasts, it will state "Dense Breasts" in the box at the top and the body of the letter would have provided information on breast density.



2. What should I do if I have dense breasts?

If your results letter indicated that you have dense breasts, we recommend that you see your family doctor for a clinical breast examination.

"The screening mammogram showed that your breasts are dense. Mammograms are significantly less sensitive in diagnosing breast cancer in women with dense breasts. We advise you to see your family doctor for a clinical breast examination. Visit <u>www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au</u> for more information."
