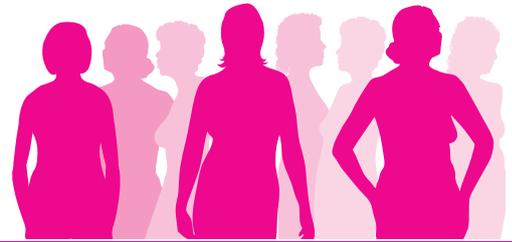

BSWA Consumer Reference Group


