Mobile in the suburbs

obile in the suburbs continues to prove successful. The next suburbs we will visit are Butler (3-14 Sept), Fremantle (17 Sept - 3 Oct) and King Edward Memorial Hospital (4-10 Oct).

Other recent areas have included QEII, Kwinana, Booragoon, Claremont and Cottesloe.

The project was initiated to address concerns in access, participation, rescreen rates and recruitment of new women and to improve access for clients who work fulltime.

We have seen an increase in uptake in overdue clients and women who have never been before. Nearly half (48%) of the women returning for a rescreen at these visits were overdue/very overdue for their mammogram and a further 23% were new to the program.

WA Scientist of the Year, Prof. Saunders is internationally recognised as one of Australia's most prominent research-orientated cancer surgeons. She has substantially contributed to many clinical aspects of breast cancer research including clinical trials of new treatments, psychosocial, translational and health services research and is active in several areas of surgical oncology cancer research, with a particular emphasis on breast cancer.

Prof. Saunders has performed research for over 25 years evaluating the efficacy and utility of therapy for early breast cancer. She was recently awarded a \$9m dollar grant to undertake research into value based healthcare in WA.
