

This kit is made for educators and administrators at Western Australian schools – to help promote Adolescent Immunisation (School Based Immunisation Program) and support families to make informed decisions about immunisation.

Young people receive important immunisations in years 7 and 10 that protect against serious and sometimes life-threatening vaccine-preventable diseases. Since adolescents often move about socially, these immunisations are also important to protect their wider families and communities by helping to build up immunity.

The resources are designed for administrators and educators to easily download, copy and personalise for your school, and to support timely and accurate communications for your school's scheduled immunisation team visit.

Adolescent immunisation | key facts

Adolescent Immunisation Program

The resources are designed for administrators and educators to easily download, copy and personalise for your school, and to support timely and accurate communications for your school's scheduled immunisation team visit.

Year 7s

Year 7 students are offered:

Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine: 1 dose The HPV vaccine protects against the human papillomavirus (HPV).

Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (dTpa) vaccine: 1 dose
The dTpa vaccine protects
against diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough (pertussis).

Year 10s

Year 10 students are offered:

Meningococcal ACWY (Men ACWY) vaccine: 1 dose.

The Men ACWY vaccine protects against 4 strains of meningococcal disease.

GENERAL IMMUNISATION DAY Subject: Adolescent Immunisation - Year 7 and Year 10 students

Dear families

WA Health in partnership with the education sector, will deliver its Adolescent Immunisation program to Year 7 and Year 10 students in high schools across Western Australia.

As part of this program, immunisation teams visit schools to provide free, routine and nationally recommended immunisations that protect individuals, families and the wider community against easily preventable diseases that could cause serious harm.

- Year 7s: diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) (dTpa) and human papillomavirus (HPV) 2 injections
- Year 10s: Meningococcal ACWY 1 injection.

Please complete the consent form (consent or decline)

Your child can't be vaccinated without your consent. You can complete the consent form via VaccinateWA.

It only takes a couple of minutes and can be done early inat the beginning of the school year, regardless of when the team will visit our school.

The Department of Health will follow up with parents who have not responded to the consent request via text message.

Hard copy form

While use of the online form is preferred, hard copies are available from [insert contact details] or you can download, complete and return to [insert contact details] from <u>Adolescent immunisation on HealthyWA</u>.

Information from paper forms will be electronically uploaded to VaccinateWA by the WA Health immunisation team and parents will receive email confirmation.

Guide for parents Adolescent immunisation – Year 7



Immunisations offered in high school

In Year 7, your child will be offered free, routine immunisations to protect them against vaccinepreventable diseases. An immunisation nursing team will visit your child's school.

 $Year\ 7\ students\ are\ offered\ 2\ immunisations:$

- Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough)
 (one injection) boosts immunity from a similar vaccination usually received during early childhood
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) (one injection) protects against some strains of HPV and relate types of cancer.

What you need to do

Complete the form (consent or decline)

Your child can not be immunised at school without your consent. Please complete the form whether you consent or decline. Completing this form as soon as possible ahead of the nursing team visit to your child's school will ensure that the team does not need to contact you to confirm your decision.

The form can be completed:

- Online (preferred method) health.wa.gov.au/ adolescent.consent Tip: The form can be completed ahead of time.
- Hard copy If you are unable to complete the online form, please download a copy from healthwas, wa.gov.au/adolescentimmunisation and return the completed form to the school.

Note: If your child attends a school on Cooss Islands or Christmas Island, please complete and return the paper form provided by the school. If your dependent is a child under the care of the Department of Communities, please contact your dependent's case worker to complete a form and return it to their school.

What to expect

When will the nursing team visit my child's high school?

The nursing teams visit high schools across WA throughout the year. Your school will let you know before immunisation day via the school's preferred communication method. If you're unsure, please check directly with the school.

How to make sure your child is prepared for immunisation

While the immunisation itself is very quick, the anticipation may cause stress for some students.

Nursing teams work extensively with high school students and are skilled at making sure your child is informed, comfortable and cared for. However, there are simple things you can do to make sure your child is prepared:

- Share with your child why vaccination is important; it helps to protect them and others in the community who may be more vulnerable
- Walk your child through the diseases they'll be protected against by receiving the vaccines.
- Talk to your child about how they are feeling about immunisation and let them know what to expect.
- Reassure with facts and show
- Make sure your child has eaten their regular meals and has water to remain hydrated.



Adolescent Immunisation

Immunisations offered in high school

In Year 10, your child will be offered free, routine immunisations to protect them against vaccinepreventable diseases. An immunisation nursing team will visit your child's school.

Year 10 students are offered:

 Meningococal ACWY – (one injection) protects against four strains of meningococcal bacteria: A, C, W and Y.

What you need to do

Complete the form (consent or decline)

Your child cannot be immunised at school without your consent. Please complete the form, whether you consent or decline. Completing this form as soon as possible ahead of the nursing team's visit to your child's school will ensure that the team does not need to contact you to confirm your desision.

The form can be completed:

- Online (preferred method) healthwa.gov.su/ adolescentconsent Tip: The form can be completed ahead of time.
- Hard copy –Completing the online form is preferred. If you are unable to complete the online form, please download a copy from healthywa, wa.qovau/a/dolescentronsent and return the completed form to the school.

Catchup if you missed

Missed vaccination at school?

Hello families,

If your child missed their vaccination at school, they are still eligible to receive a catch-up vaccine from another immunisation provider.


Participating community pharmacists and community immunisation clinics will provide the vaccination for free. You can also visit your GP or Aboriginal Medical Service (the vaccine is free, but consultation fees may apply).





